GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

- Submit the abstract as Word File and not a PDF.
- Font style - Times New Roman, Font size -12, Line spacing - 1.0
- Mention the theme under which you are submitting the abstract above the title.
- Title should be in Sentence case and bold (Limited to 25 words).
- Author and Co-author details: Surname followed by first name. No title [Mr., Ms., Prof., Dr., etc.] or qualification [Ph.D., M.Sc., etc.] should be added.
- The name of the presenting author should be bold and underlined.
- Authors from different institutions should be identified by superscript numbers at the end of that author's name.
- On the next line write down the Department/s, Institution/s, City, State.
- Email ID and Mobile number of the presenting author should be provided for correspondence at the end of the abstract.
- The abstract should not exceed 300 words. It should be structured to include background/ introduction, objectives, methods, results and conclusion. If you wish to provide one-two key references, then they should be given in at the end of the abstract in Vancouver style using a font size of 10.
- No graphs/images/tables should be included in the abstract.
- Avoid the use of abbreviations in the title as well as in the abstract. However, if the words will be repeated multiple times, write the abbreviation in the bracket when first time the words are used and subsequently use the abbreviation e.g., blood pressure (BP) when used for first time and then followed by BP.
