

Integrating Gerodontology: A Call to Enhance Dental Education for Comprehensive Elderly Care




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Introduction

- WHO has submitted "Call for Public Health Action" for oral health of older people.
- These problems can be overcome in dental profession by inclusion of education, clinical programmes, research agendas relating to "Gerodontology" in dental curriculum.
- Though there is increasing demand for geriatric oral health care but no formal training has been introduced in the dental curriculum.

Aim & Objectives

 To assess and compare the knowledge, attitude and practices of comprehensive geriatric oral health care among dental undergraduates before & after the online teaching activity.



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- Highly significant improvement in knowledge and attitude before and after the module (p<0.005).
- Majority of the undergraduate students had below average knowledge and attitude before the module with 3rd year students having least. (p<0.05).

Conclusion

- Integrating gerodontology into dental education is crucial for improving care for the elderly, given their unique dental needs and challenges
- Inclusion of gerodontology curriculum as a part of service based for dental undergraduates is in the need of hour in India
