Credit System:

The Undergraduate program is a choice based credit system (CBCS) providing choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor). Under the CBCS, the requirement for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students. Each programme will have a curriculum in which every course will be assigned certain credits reflecting its weight and contact periods per week.

For the award of the Undergraduate programme of B.A./ B.Sc. (LIBERAL EDUCATION) degree, a candidate shall have 136 credits. This normally divided into Theory courses, Tutorials, Activities, Laboratory courses, Capstone Project/Research Project/Dissertation and Industrial Tour/Survey /Presentation/Training in duration of six semesters. The credits are distributed semester wise as shown in the structure and syllabus manual of the programme.

Courses generally progress in sequences, building competencies and their positioning indicates certain academic maturity on the part of the learners. Learners are expected to follow the semester wise schedule of courses given in the syllabus manual of the programmes.
